December 2022 Preaching Schedule

November 27, 2022 – Contentment – Where Do We Find It? (Philippians 4:4-9)

It seems as if contentment is harder and harder to find. Moments of joy and peace are few and far between. It seems with COVID, inflation, recession, the personal challenges we face, contentment is harder to find. But the gateway to contentment may be more accessible than you think.

December 4, 2022 – King Jesus! (Matthew 2:1-8)

On the night of Jesus' birth, a king had been secreted into the world. A king who would disturb the order of things, a king who would lay down his life for his subjects rather than requiring his subjects to lay down their lives for him. A king who would tell his disciples to lay down their lives for one another and if need be, their enemies. He would turn everything upside down, not as a religious figure but as a king. This reality has been lost on us because of what the culture had done to Jesus and what the church has done to Jesus. Jesus didn't come primarily to forgive. He came to be followed.

December 11, 2022 – Conflicted Kingdoms (Matthew 2:9-16)

It took about 40 years for the world to know and come to grips with the fact that God had sent a king into the world in the form of Jesus. A king whose kingdom would come in conflict from this world. 40 years after Christ's birth, in Syria, a term came into use to describe a political movement where Greeks and Romans were swearing allegiance to a brand-new king. He was called a Christos or anointed one. This God king they were reference had been crucified 10 or 12 years before by Rome. And this guy to whom they swore allegiance to was not only a king but a God. But this God king did not require sacrifice. Instead, he came to earth to be the final sacrifice. Not like a good luck charm but the sacrifice for sin. He required something other than sacrifice. He required allegiance and obedience. Roman didn't care who you worshipped but you obeyed Caesar. But that didn't work in Antioch anymore. And this new understanding of this God king began to take over the world.

December 18, 2022 – For Unto Us (Luke 2:8-12)

When Jesus was born, it was different. Those there at Christmas witnessed the birth of Jesus, they knew they were experiencing something different. They had a little context for the birth they did not know exactly what he would do and how he would do it. But they knew He was different. They had a different frame work they put this birth into, they had an idea of who he would be and they had a clear picture of the character he would live with and lead with. They knew he was born to be a king, but they also knew because of his character this king would be different. They knew he was different from any king this world had seen.

December 25 – And God Came Near (Luke 2:1-20)

Christmas has finally arrived. Join us as we celebrate the birth of the Our King! Experience with us the events surrounding the birth. His dramatic escape from the king who wanted to destroy him. And realize with us, how much the world missed out on in the Little town of Bethlehem on that dark night when the King came bursting on the scene.

CROCKPOT TURKEY BREAST

- 1 bone-in, skin-on turkey breast, room temperature (about 6 lb)
- 2 **tbsp.** packed light brown sugar
- 1 **tbsp.** chili powder
- 1 **tbsp.** smoked paprika
- 1 **tsp.** garlic powder
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 **c.** low-sodium chicken broth
- 1/4 **c.** low-sodium soy sauce
- 2 **tbsp.** honey
- 2 **tbsp.** freshly chopped parsley

1. Grease a large slow cooker with cooking spray. Roll a large piece of aluminum foil into a rope and then fold the rope into an oval. Place in slow cooker, creating a rack for the turkey.

2. In a small bowl, whisk together brown sugar, chili powder, paprika, and garlic powder. Pat turkey dry with paper towels and season generously with salt and pepper. Press sugar mixture all over turkey, then place in slow cooker, breast side up.

3. Whisk together chicken broth, soy sauce, and honey and pour into bottom of the slow cooker.

4. Cook on low for 3 to 4 hours, until a thermometer inserted into thickest part of the breast reads 165°.

5. Heat broiler. Transfer turkey to a rimmed baking sheet and broil until skin is crispy and golden, 3 to 4 minutes. Let rest for 15 minutes before slicing.

Garnish with parsley and serve.
